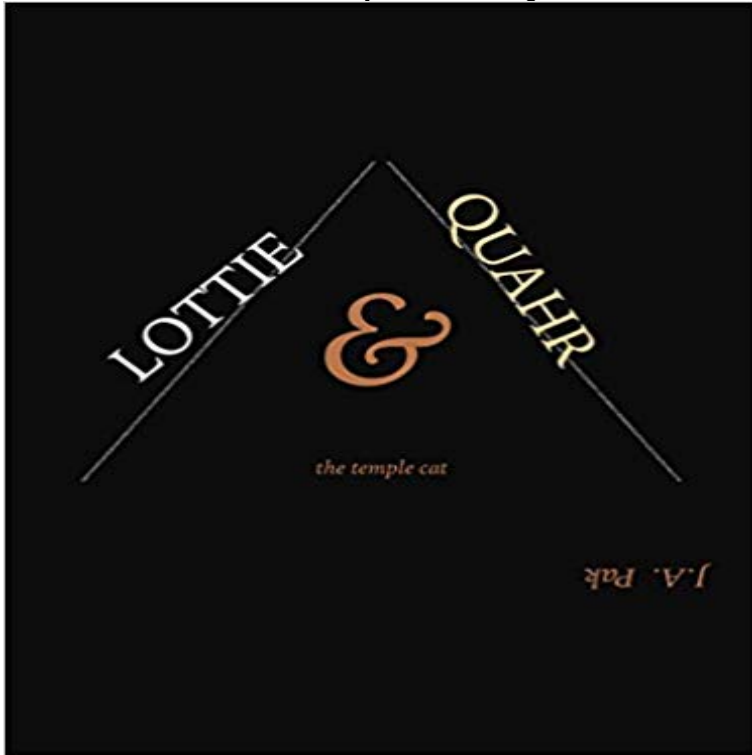


Lottie & The Temple Cat Quahr
