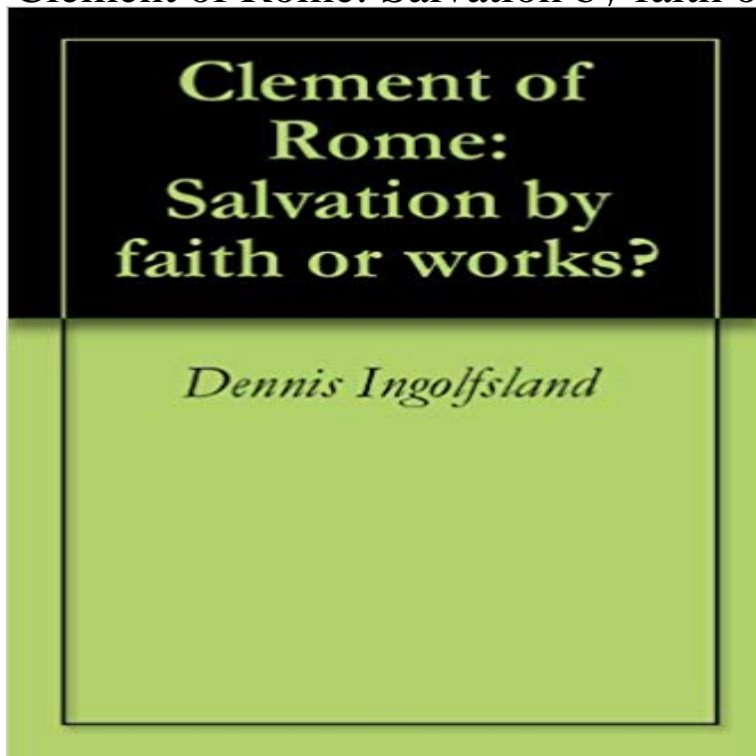


Clement of Rome: Salvation by faith or works?



Clement of Rome was a highly respected bishop in Rome. His letter to the Corinthians, written in the 90s AD, is one of the earliest, if not the earliest, primary Christian sources after the New Testament. Although modern scholars are skeptical, both Origen and Eusebius assert that Clement of Rome was the same person Paul had praised in Philippians 4:3 as a fellow worker. Clement's lengthy letter is filled with moral and ethical exhortations and it is an important witness to how the teachings of the Old Testament, Jesus, and the apostles were heard and communicated in the earliest post-biblical times.
